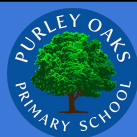


Key Question: How has Purley Oaks changed over time?



Historical Vocabulary

decade	A period of 10 years.
century	A period of 100 years.
blackboard	A hard smooth dark surface used for writing or drawing on with chalk.
slate	A material used for writing on.
dip pens	Pens older children used for writing with.
inkwell	A place in a child's desk that would hold ink for their pen.
cane	A wooden stick used for hitting children when they broke the rules.
Dunce's hat	Misbehaving children would have to sit in the corner and wear this hat.
