

P.E. Funding Statement 2024-25

Total P.E. and Sport funding for the current academic year 2024-25 will be £21,090.

Brief overview of PE and sport provision, including facilities in the school

Sport has always been an important part of the Education provision provided at Purley Oaks Primary School. Class teachers and a P.E specialist teach P.E lessons at Purley Oaks. Staff have had CPD on various aspects of PE, resources are well stocked and a large number of clubs are in place. The school enters Croydon leagues for both football and netball.

The Physical Environment

Indoor Provision

Purley Oaks has 2 large halls in which PE lessons take place. The hall is used by extra-curricular club providers to run after school clubs for Purley Oaks pupils such as gymnastics and football.

Outdoor Provision

When the weather is suitable, we make use of our outdoor space, which now includes a netball court, and two sports pitches. In Reception and our two nurseries, there are climbing frames for children to use to refine their gross motor skills.

Current Provision at Purley Oaks:

Football – The school enters the school football league each year and the team receives weekly training after school from a sports specialist free of charge.

The school has an external provider delivering after school provision for Rec-Y4.

Girls' football – Girls are invited to attend the football club after school each week and partake in football fixtures.

Netball – The school has a long history of entering the league and performing well against other local schools. In 2023-2024 the girls team made it to the finals.

Gymnastics – The school provides gymnastics as part of the curriculum. Children are also able to attend an after school club should they wish to develop their skills further.

Swimming – The school offers all year 4 children the opportunity. Each class has a two-week block of daily swimming lessons in the summer term.

Athletics – Pupils take part in the annual Croydon Sports athletics competition and regularly perform well.

School PE and sport development priorities based on our school context and identified pupil need.

- More opportunities for EYFS to develop gross motor skills
- Better provision of PE equipment for lessons
- Better provision of sports equipment for lunch times and playtimes

Quality assurance. What systems are in place to ensure value for money and the involvement of the school leadership team in overseeing the effectiveness of the projects?

The Assistant Headteacher for curriculum oversees all sport provision alongside the P.E. coordinator. Decisions are then discussed at weekly SLT meetings.
