A view from above.

town

A place with lots of houses and shops. Larger than a village, smaller than a city. Croydon is a town.

village

A small group of houses, perhaps with a few shops, that are often in the countryside. Chaldon is a village.

church

A public place of worship usually for people of the Christian religion.

shop

A building or part of a building where goods or services are sold.

route

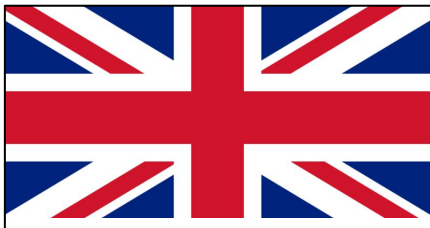
A way from one place to another.

country

A large area of land where people live under the same government.

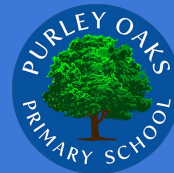
