

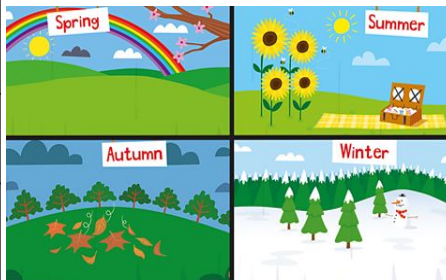
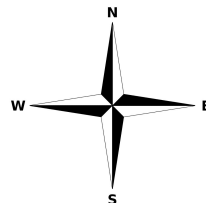
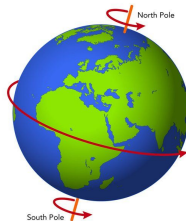


Key Question: Where am I in the World?

Where is the UK?

Geographical Vocabulary

continent	A large solid area of land. There are seven continents
weather	The way the air and atmosphere feels
seasons	For different times of the year with four different types of weather
atlas	A collection of maps
equator	An imaginary line drawn around the middle of the earth
north/south pole	At the northern and southern axis' of the earth
compass	A tool for finding direction
directions	The line or course of which something moves, lies or points

Key Facts: The World

- The largest continent is Asia
- The smallest continent is Oceania/ Australia
- Africa has 54 countries- more than any other continent!
- The equator divides the earth into the northern hemisphere and the southern hemisphere
- The equator is just under 25,000 miles long
- Sunrise at the north pole happens once a year
- Mount Erebus is an active volcano found in the Antarctic. It ejects ice crystals
