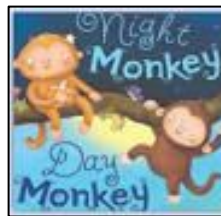
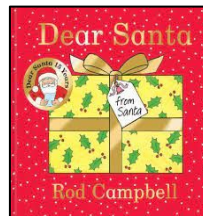
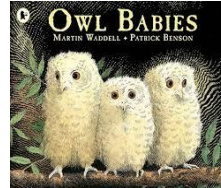
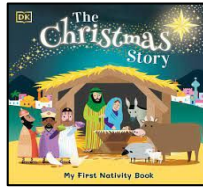
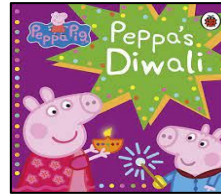
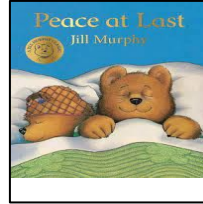


In this topic, **we are learning to:**

Vocabulary	
Diwali	The Hindu and Sikh celebration of light. A festival to remember the story of Rama and Sita.
Christmas	Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus. Christmas day is celebrated on 25th December.
festival	A festival is a day or a few of days when people come together to celebrate.
rangoli pattern	A Rangoli pattern is a colourful design made on the floor using coloured rice powder, chalk or coloured sand.
diva lamp	A small oil lamp (usually made from clay) used to celebrate Diwali
celebration	To enjoy a significant or happy day or event with a gathering of friends or family or to take part in an enjoyable activity.
nocturnal	Animals that are awake in the night and asleep through the day.
