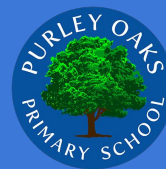


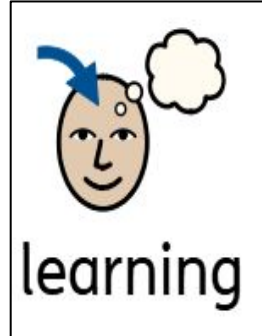
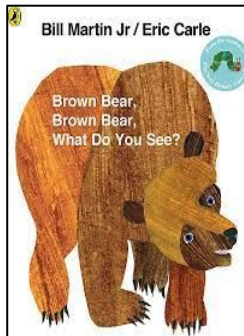
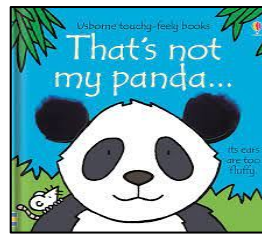
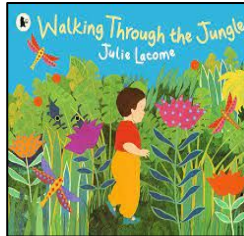
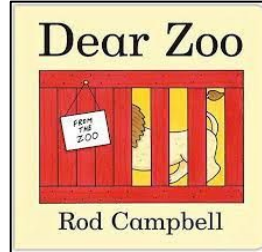
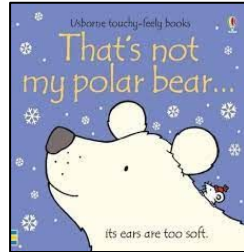


# Key Question: How do I become the best learner?



In this topic, **we are learning to:**

- Develop our sense of responsibility and membership of a community;
- Show more confidence in new social situations;
- Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas;
- Follow rules, understanding why they are important;
- Talk with others to solve conflicts;
- Talk about our feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried';
- Begin to understand how others might be feeling;
- Begin to make sense of our own life-story and family's history.



Vocabulary	
<b>learning</b>	We are learning in nursery through our play all the time. It might be learning how to write our name, go to the toilet by ourselves or learning how to climb up the climbing frame using a rope.
<b>sharing</b>	Sharing is about compromise and fairness. It's a key part of getting along with your new friends and working together.
<b>caring</b>	Caring for our friends is very important in nursery and making sure they are happy and safe.
<b>ourselves</b>	Making sure we are ready to learn everyday . That we have our book bags and water bottles. We need to be independent and know how to put our coat on.
<b>listening</b>	We need to listen to learn. Listening to instructions or hearing about what our new learning is. We need to be focused.
<b>rules</b>	These ensure that we are all kept happy and safe. They tell us things that we should and should not do.
