- -identify the four countries making up the United Kingdom.








Phonics Screening

• In year 1 the children have a phonics screening check which is a national test that takes place in the summer term. It is to check the children's phonic knowledge and consists of real and nonsense words. They are required to get at least 32/40 correct and if they do not pass the screening it will need to be repeated in year 2. Throughout the year the children will be taught the required phonemes and digraphs in order to prepare them for this check.
