

From phonics to spelling

In year 2, we are starting a new spelling programme for 2023/4 which is designed as a seamless link from the core Little Wandle Phonics programme to teaching spelling in Year 2.



ATTENDANCE

- Children are expected to be in school every day and on time
- Data from 2019 shows that 84% of Key Stage 2 pupils who had 100% attendance achieved the expected standard, compared to 40% of pupils who were persistently absent across the key stage.
- Attendance below 96% has a negative impact on learning



ONLINE SAFETY

- The school planner has good information on acceptable use of devices.
 At the beginning of term, children will go through the expectations for online safety.
- At school, we will be having lessons throughout the year about how to stay safe online. We call it computing-safety.
- It is important to be vigilant at home. Check what your child is accessing online and use parental controls.
- Our behaviour expectations are the same even when using technology at home. Incidents of cyber bullying reported to the school will be dealt with in line with our policy.

Key Question: Was London always a cool place? Why was the Great Fire of London so catastrophic?





Historical Vocabulary bakery a place where bread or cakes are made and sold the capital city of England and the United London Kingdom an important man-made historical object artefacts a personal record of life's events diary eye-witness a person who has seen something and can give a description small pieces of glowing coal or wood in a embers dying fire flammable something that burns easily





In this topic, we are learning to:

- explore events beyond living memory that are significant nationally.
- -explore significant historical events, people and places in their own locality.
- -develop an understanding of how the past impacts our lives today.
- understand primary and secondary resources.

Timeline

Sunday 2nd September 1666 A fire starts in Thomas Farriner's bakery on Pudding Lane, as news of the fire spreads, people run to escape its path.

Monday 3rd September 1666 Firefighters try to tackle the fire but it spreads quickly. People carry their possessions to safety using a horse and cart or boats on the River Thames.

Tuesday 4th September 1666 Houses are pulled down in an attempt to stop the fire spreading. St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed.

Wednesday 5th September 1666 The fire starts to burn more slowly as the wind dies down.

Thursday 6th September The fire is finally under control and put out.

People are left homeless.
