

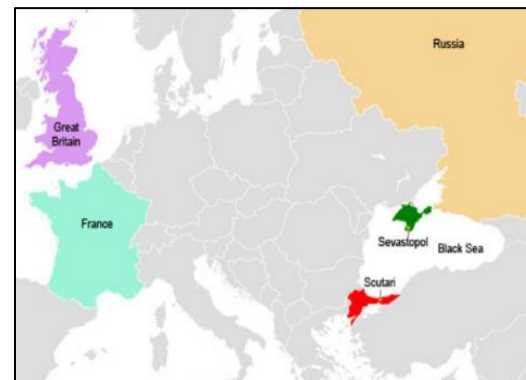
Historical Vocabulary

Crimean War	a war between Russia and Britain/France/Turkey
herbal remedies	plants used like medicines to prevent or cure diseases
charity	giving help by choice to people in need
Red Cross medal	a military medal awarded in the UK and Commonwealth for exceptional services in military nursing.
Creole	a person of mixed European and black descent, especially in the Caribbean.
pestle and mortar	a device made up of a bowl (the mortar) and a heavy, blunt object (the pestle), the end of which is used for crushing and grinding ingredients or substances
unhygienic	dirty or unclean

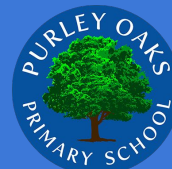
What were conditions in hospitals like during the Crimean War?
